Dual Credits: two high school credits and two college courses

Digital Photography – AFK4T (College Course: GRD124)

The student will become familiar with basic, traditional camera techniques as well as digital imaging. Special effects and conventional darkroom manipulation will be taught with appropriate computer applications. In addition to developing basic technical competency in photography, the course will instill in the student a sense of visual literacy.

Computer Imagery – TGB4T (College Course: GRD114)

This course will explore the endless and exciting possibilities of an image editing and painting program. Introductory exercises will highlight colour systems; file size relationships, scanned images, palettes, layers, channels, type and special effects. Through practical assignments, students will develop an understanding of rasterized imagery, photo manipulation, and special effects to be used for print or web based design. The skills learned in this course will enable the students to more productively complete assignments and projects required in other courses and in the workplace.

Note:

- Tuition, materials, equipment and transportation fees will be covered through the Dual Credit program.
- All students are expected to attend an orientation session prior to taking part in any Dual Credit program.
- Students will be contacted by the SCWI Program Assistant, at least one week prior to the start of the program, to be provided with a date, time and location for each orientation session.
- Delivery: Afternoon or morning release for one semester.
- Students involved in the Dual Credit program will be excused from their regular classes or co-op to attend the College.

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
