One of the biggest takeaways from the presentation was that to have a social worker present to help guide a student through that transition;</li> <li>The Committee approved the Three-Year Plan;</li> <li>Through EPCA, ACSES has been meeting with other School Boards with regards to Special Needs. It has been decided that a meeting take place four times a year to exchange the best practices and different ideas that are being done at our School Boards;</li> <li>There have been new members that have been selected to join the Committee;</li> <li>St. Raphael School will be housed in a new building in order to have more space in which will be presented as a Centre for Excellence for our students with behavioral and socio-emotional needs. <u>17.2 High School of Montreal Adult Education Centre – Request for Name Change – Following</u> Consultation

**WHEREAS** on April 7, 2022, the EMSB Board Administrators received from the High School of Montreal Adult Education Centre Governing Board a Request for Name change, to shorten the name of the Centre to its acronym The HSM Adult Education Centre;

**WHEREAS** the name High School of Montreal Adult Education Centre causes some confusion when marketing the Centre and trying to attract adult students, given that the words 'high school' are in the title;

**WHEREAS** the High School of Montreal Adult Education Centre is commonly referred to as HSM or The HSM Adult Education Centre;
