SCHOOL GOVERNING BOARD

Each year every school holds a general assembly of parents to elect representatives to the governing board which is made up of an equal number of parents and school staff. From the elected parents, the general assembly elects a delegate and alternate delegate to the parents' committee. The Governing Board approves issues such as: the educational project, subject time allocation, school budget and is also consulted on textbooks, instructional materials and school closings.

EMSB PARENTS COMMITTEE (EMSBPC)

The PC is composed of all delegates from the schools and a member of ACSES. The EMSBPC designates parents who will take part in the various committees established by the school board such as: Education Committee, Finance Committee, Transportation, Educational Policies, and Adult Education & Vocational Services Advisory Committee. The EMSBPC gives advice on subjects conducive to the most efficient operation of the school board. They inform the school board of the needs of parents and they give recommendations to the school board on matters such as: school closures, Deeds of Establishment, school calendar, dedication of a school to a special project, policy on Financial Contributions from Parents or Students. The EMSBPC elects four parent commissioners (elementary, secondary, ACSES & other) to sit at the Council of Commissioners

All EMSBPC meetings are open to the public and everyone is welcome to attend.

PARENT PARTICIPATION ORGANIZATION / HOME & SCHOOL (PPO / H&S)

The Parent participation Organization and the Home & School promotes parental involvement through volunteering, fundraising and school activities. They are also consulted on the school's objectives, parent expectations and specific projects or issues.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES (ACSES)

ACSES advises the School Board on issues which affect children who are learning disabled, intellectually handicapped, hearing and visually impaired, physically handicapped or socially maladjusted. They advise the School Board on issues arising from the delivery of educational services to special needs students and the allocation of financial resources for those services. ACSES is comprised of parents, teachers, a non-teaching professional, a specialized support person, a principal, a representative from an organization that provides services to special needs students and officers of the School Board.

ENGLISH MONTREAL STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE (EMSAC)

Composed of 28 students from 14 different high schools, this committee links the students and the Council of Commissioners allowing them to discuss common issues. They respond to Board consultations, and explore solutions that will produce an enriched school environment. The committee allows the students to develop necessary leadership skills needed to become future leaders in our community, the business world and beyond.

COUNCIL OF COMMISSIONERS

The Council of Commissioners is elected by the public. They hold monthly meetings at the Administration Building which are open to the public and provide an opportunity to pose questions. Questions should be forwarded to the Secretary General at the EMSB by noon of the day of the Council meeting.
