Key Features of Essential Knowledge of the Three Musical Competencies

√ To interpret musical pieces

- To become familiar with the musical content of the piece(s)
 (musicallanguage, structure and graphic representation of pitch, duration, intensityand form)
- To apply elements of technique (posture, holding position, sound production, intonation, fingerings) as well as care and maintenance of the instrument.
- To bring out the expressive elements of the piece
- To apply the rules for group ensemble work
- To share his/her interpretation experience

✓ To invent instrumental pieces

- To use ideas inspired by a stimulus for creation
- To use sound sources (instrument) and elements of musical language and technique
- To organize the elements the student has chosen
- To finalize a production
- To share the student's creative experience

√ To appreciate musical works

- To examine a musical work or excerpt for elements of content
- To examine a musical work or excerpt for socio-cultural references
- · To make connections between what the student has felt and examined
- To make a critical or aesthetic judgment
- To share their appreciation experience
