Important Days:

<u>Phys. Ed.</u> <u>K5A</u>: Tuesday & Friday – Ms. Karine <u>K5B</u>: Tuesday & Friday – Mr. Mike

**This period lasts only 30 minutes and therefore the children will not have time to change their clothes, however they should come to school with their phys. ed .t-shirt or white t-shirt, black shorts/pants and running shoes. **

<u>Music</u> <u>K5A</u>: Monday & Thursday– Ms. Alongi <u>K5B</u>: Monday & Wednesday – Ms. Alongi

During this period, the children will engage in songs and movement. They will discover new and fascinating instruments.

Art K5A: Wednesday - Ms. Stephanie S. K5B: Thursday - Ms. Stephanie S.

During this period, the children are introduced to various art techniques.

<u>Bibliothèque:</u> K5A and K5B will be visiting the library on Tuesday. The school librarian (Miss Nancy Lento) will read to your children once a week. During this library visit, the children will choose two French age-appropriate books, which they borrow for one week. Only the children who return their books the following week will be allowed to choose another book.

Reading stories with your children daily will allow your child to develop an interest in books and reading.

Show and Tell: We will begin soon. MORE INFO WILL FOLLOW. You will receive a letter/schedule.

<u>Personal and Community Development Animator</u>: Ms. Mary will offer interactive and stimulating activities of Community and Humanitarian nature while implementing a wide variety of activities that inspire the practice of virtues in everyday life.

Workbooks:


We have printed workbooks to be used in the classroom (alphabet, math, colours, pre-writing & pre-reading). Please note that some of the workbooks will be sent home for review and/or homework. (More information to follow)

<u>Cahier Thématique</u>: Your child will come home on Friday with a cahier thématique. He/she can go over the songs and vocabulary words we learned during the week.

<u>Cahier Mes Poèmes:</u> Your child will come home on Friday with a cahier Mes Poèmes. This workbook is used to practice a poem for the letter of the week and short dialogue for the word of the week.

<u>Mon petit sac de lettres et mots:</u> Your child will come home with a small ziploc bag with the letter and the word of the week to practice at home.

Report Card/Progress Report: This year we will have 1 progress report and 3 report cards.



Agenda: Please complete information page and read the school rules and regulations and sign the agenda. The agenda should always go back and forth from home and school, and it should be a source of communication between us. Please let us know of any schedule changes concerning your child, such as pick-up, bus or daycare routines. Also, please initial it every day so we are aware you have seen our notes or memos.

<u>Pochette:</u> All letters to and from school should be placed in the Pochette, it will be checked daily.

<u>Microsoft Teams:</u> We will be using Teams as another source of communication. Please download the app and search for your child's class.

E-mail: Monthly calendars and most memos will be sent via e-mail. Please ensure that the school's email is in your contact list.

<u>Dress Code:</u> Students are expected to wear school colors; white top and black pant, skirt, tunic. A red, white, and black sweater can be worn in school when needed. **PLEASE LABEL ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING.**

All long hair is encouraged to be tied back. We strongly discourage running shoes with lights, costume jewellery, watches and toys, these items can be very distracting.

<u>Change of clothes:</u> Please bring to school a t-shirt, pair of socks, underwear and a pair of pants in a Ziploc bag. Please label all items including the Ziploc bag. The extra clothes will remain in school.

<u>Snacks:</u> Gerald McShane is a <u>nut-free school</u>. Therefore, it is crucial that you do not send any snacks that contain nuts. Please do not send chocolates, chips, candy, chocolate cookies, chocolate cake or fruit roll-ups. Fruits, vegetables, and milk products are a healthier alternative. If you order a Hot Lunch (can be done on the EMSB website), please include two snacks from home. The milk program and the breakfast program will begin soon.

<u>Recess</u>: The children will be going outside three times throughout the day, as per the government's regulation to include an extra recess in the afternoon.

Morning recess is from 10a.m. – 10:20a.m., lunch & recess is from 11:02p.m.-12:15p.m. and afternoon recess is from 1:15p.m.-1:35p.m.

<u>Dismissal:</u> The kindergarten children will be dismissed at **2:30p.m**. before the general dismissal in order to alleviate heavy traffic.



Standards and Procedures

Preschool Cycle-K4 & K5

Overview of Assessment and Evaluation

The planning of assessment and evaluation is done in compliance with the Preschool Cycle Program.

The teacher uses their professional judgment to make decisions based on all the evidence gathered. Some examples of the evidence that may be gathered to inform teaching practices and the learning process include, but are not limited to: anecdotal notes, conversations with the child, photos of the child at play, videos, or productions they may have created.

As set out in the Basic School Regulation, the student's results in preschool education are recorded as observations on the report card, showing, for each area of development, the status of the development of the competencies that were evaluated. The last report card of the year provides a summary showing the status of development the child has reached in each competency.

Teachers will communicate with families once a month regarding the progress of students experiencing learning or behavioural difficulties. The teacher will choose a suitable means of communication to provide families with this information.

OBSERVATIONS:

The student is making very good progress on the competency.

The student is making satisfactory progress on the competency.

The student is making progress on the competency but shows some difficulties.

The student is making progress on the competency but shows significant difficulties.
