Did you know that LDVA is officially a *Force 4* school? What does this mean? Force 4 is a school-support program that provides equipment and ideas to get kids moving **for at least an hour a day**. It is part of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education's "Move to School" that aims to encourage primary school students to be physically active for at least 60 minutes a day which is the standard recommended by the World Health Organization for young people. Force 4 is put into action by the Grand Défi Pierre Lavoie and is supported by the Government of Quebec.

Frequently Asked Questions & Answers:

Why are people allowed to smoke around the school?

- They are not! By municipal law, no one is allowed to smoke 9 meters from school grounds and playgrounds (parks). Therefore, there should be no smoking at the entrance/dismissal gate.
- People smoking within 9 meters of these areas risk receiving a fine.

Can the school do something about the double parking?

- The school has contacted and made an official request to the city to change the signage along Joliot Curie entrance/dismissal gate. We are also working together with our local police department.
- Parents are asked to please follow the rules and regulations of the road.
- Parents can also use Francois Larocque Street to park and then proceed to the gate for drop-off and pick-up.
- Individuals who are double-parking risk receiving a fine.

Why doesn't the school inform us when someone is getting tested for Covid-19?

- Parents will often take precautions and have their children tested when they show signs and symptoms of a cold or cough after consulting with Santé Publique. These signs and symptoms are similar to those of Covid-19 and therefore it may be recommended by Santé Publique that the child be tested for Covid-19. **Due to privacy laws, the Ministry and school are not allowed to divulge this information unless a test result is positive.**

What happens when someone tests positive for Covid-19 in the school?

- The school is obligated to inform the school community under the Santé Publique guidelines and directives.
- Santé Publique or the school administration will be in contact with staff, parents and students directly affected by possible exposure.
- The school must follow all directives given by Santé Publique when someone tests positive in the school.

Can a parent or staff member hide the fact that someone tested positive for Covid-19?

- No. Santé Publique is obligated to inform the school and in-turn, the school is obligated to inform the school community, even if that parent did not directly inform the school.

Please rest assured, the school is taking every precaution and safety measure seriously to ensure the health and safety of our students and staff. We take pride in the positive feedback we have received from the CSSS, Santé Publique and our community for the implementation and quick-response to following the protocols. Please continue to help us maintain these safety measures by following the directives.

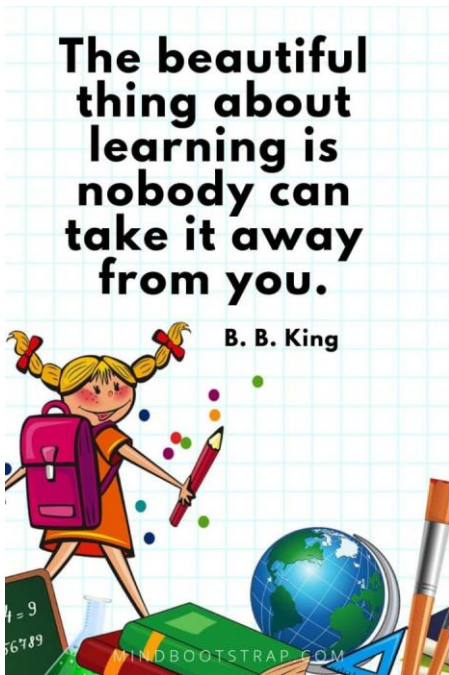
