The Preschool Curriculum mandated by the Quebec Ministry of Education (see table below) is divided into six competencies that will be evaluated at least twice during the school year in English. Some competencies are not evaluated during certain terms in order to give students more time to develop these.

Your child's progress will be monitored and evaluated using a variety of assessment tools and strategies. These include classroom observation, participation, student work, and rubrics. Please note that **Google Classroom** will also be used in the event of a school closure and where distance learning is necessary.

He is able to adapt his actions to his environment and becomes aware of the importance of taking care of his body and interacting within his learning environment safely and soundly</p>

He makes personal choices, takes initiatives and assumes responsibility. He is able to recognise his strengths and is beginning to become aware of his limits.</p>

He is learning how to resolve social conflict in the spirit of mutual respect and justice. He shares his toys and ideas with those around him. He adopts and respects the classroom rules established by his peers.</p>

He understands what is said and is able to produce a message using a variety of means to express his ideas. For example, tells a story, uses proper words to convey a message, uses a pictogram to convey a message.</p>

He expresses what he knows and is able to explain the process and strategies he used to complete a given task.</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;">Completes projects or activities</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Methodological Development</p>	<p><b>To complete an activity or project.</b>                      Your child engages in, uses his creative thought processes and demonstrates his perseverance throughout the completion of a project and/or activity. He is able to express his satisfaction and is able to explain the steps he took to complete the task at hand.</p>
