3. Adoption of the Governing Board Minutes of January 22, 2019.



- The budget priorities will be sent to the school board.






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5. Reports

5.1 Principal

- a) Allongé Program (Approval Required):
 - The Allongé Program is a 1-year modified high school program which precedes the Regular Grade 7 curriculum.
 - In order to be eligible for the Allongé Program, students should be achieving at least at the Grade 3/4 level in English and Math. Successful students in this program will spend three years in Cycle 1 (as opposed to two years).
 - Their first year in this program will focus on reviewing basic elementary level concepts and skills
 in order to prepare them to follow the Regular Grade 7 Program in the following year, with
 adaptations as needed. The students will continue in the resource program for the remainder of
 their high school years to receive the adaptations required for success.
 - Motion to move forward with offering the program as part of our programs.
 - ✓ Casey Gagne moved to adopt the Allongé Program.
 - ✓ Patricia Gaudio seconded the motion.
 - ✓ All were in favor.
- b) Sport Études Study Hall Proposal (Approval Required):
 - As it stands, our Sport études day ends at 12:33 p.m.
 - In other Sport études schools, students are dismissed, and study hall and tutorials are offered on an optional basis.
 - Since being a healthy athlete requires rest periods before games and competitions, when students are not in their sport, they would either be dismissed at the start of lunch or choose to remain at school for a teachers' tutorials during period 4 or study hall ONLY if they have work.
 - At the present moment, it has become a baby-sitting service since students become very disruptive
 when they have no school work to catch-up on, taking away from the purpose of the study hall
 period.
 - The school would be responsible for those remaining.
 - The \$100 program fee will also be revisited since our first transition year with the new guidelines from the Ministry will be over. More to follow later when guidelines are clarified.
 - ✓ Motion to move forward with offering the program as part of our programs.
 - ✓ Clorinda Antonacci moved to adopt the Sport Études Study Hall Proposal.
 - ✓ Lily Zarlenga seconded the motion.
 - ✓ All were in favor.
- c) Graduation Scholarships (Approval Required):
 - GB fund to be donated to offer two \$125 scholarships at the graduation ceremony.
 - Motion to be approved.
 - ✓ Marisa Papillo moved to adopt the Graduation Scholarships
 - ✓ Casey Gagne seconded the motion.
 - ✓ All were in favor.

g) Educational Project Update (Information Item):


- The document is 90% ready for presentation at the next GB.

Budget Priorities:

Within the context of declining enrolment-and therefore decreasing subsidiesestablishing budget priorities can realistically imply that these priorities *could* simply be exempted from reductions. In this light, please list, in order of priority, the needs among the schools/centres which you feel are most important:

- 1. Staffing: Increase the number of resource teachers, Child Care Workers (CCW), Administrators and increase the professionals (i.e. Psychologist and Guidance Counselors) for all students.
- 2. Technology: Improve infrastructure, equipment and professional development in order to enhance student learning and success including an increase in the number of technicians to maintain the technology systems.
- 3. Maintain the budget for literacy and increase the budget for numeracy and for technological literacy in all cycles.
- 4. Maintain spending for educational materials and educational programs (i.e. texts, software, subscriptions).
- 5. Environment, Health and Safety (i.e. building improvements, security, maintenance).

Please note this list is part of the overall budget planning process. As the MEES funding parameters become known, some funds may have to be directed to specific spending initiatives per Ministry requirements.
