LBP Governing Board Principal's Report

Changes to the Calendar

As mentioned in the news, the ministry has adjusted the school calendar. One of these adjustments includes the addition of three pedagogical days. Two of those days were selected by the school board and approved by the council of commissioners. The third day must be selected by Lester B Pearson High School and approved at the December Governing Board meeting.

- Friday, January 8 Board Pedagogical Day
- Friday, February 5 Board Pedagogical Day
- Monday, May 3 LBP Pedagogical Day (To be approved by GB)

Distance Education

The ministry has issued a directive that high schools will move to distance education on December 17 and 18 as well as January 4 to January 8. All pedagogical days already scheduled are to be maintained despite the move to distance learning. Lester B Pearson already had a pedagogical day scheduled on Monday, January 4 and the EMSB added another pedagogical day on January 8th (see above). Over 130 laptops and iPads have been loaned to LBP families by the school. Two of those include internet connections

Regular in-person classes will resume on Monday, January 11, Day 5. At that time students will resume their attendance based on the Red Zone restrictions imposed earlier in the year.

Report Cards

As mentioned earlier in the year, Term 1 will end on December 18. Report cards will be published on Mozaik for students and parents on Monday, January 18, 2021. As you know, there are only two terms in 2020-2021, each with a value of 50%. The ministry has also announced that Secondary 4 and 5 uniform exams will only have a value of 20%. This is a big change from the 50% or 100% previously.

Zen Zone Opened at LBP

1. The Zen Zone is a dedicated room in the school where students can go to collect themselves or self regulate, giving them the opportunity to learn how to manage their emotions which is a valuable life skill. It is a safe place where students can go for personal reflection (i.e. vent, calm down, talk, do work), when having difficulty working or focusing in class. Special Ed Technicians are available every day to give our students emotional support and guide them to plan and make better decisions the next time.

The goal is to help de-escalate, prevent blow-ups, give them the opportunity for personal reflection and create positive learning experiences. Personal reflection time can improve understanding, transform perspectives and enables them to grow from their experiences. The Zen Zone can easily accommodate several students at a time, creating a more "acceptable" (less

punishing) environment. It is not a consequence but rather a place where they can plan, be proactive and prevent certain behaviours from reoccurring.

- 2. The room will also be a place to practice mindfulness/meditation. Mindfulness helps students with anxiety manage their stress more effectively and work through it more quickly. Research suggests that mindfulness programs can improve cognitive performance as well as resilience to stress.
- 3. The Zen Zone is a setting where students can move and exert some energy while working. Students feel empowered by having some degree of choice and control over their environment. Flexible seating allows students to choose where they can work and allows them to change their location and positions as needed. Some students need to move more than others do. Flexible seating allows them to wobble, rock, bounce, lean or stand which increases oxygen flow and keeps young minds more alert and focused.

LBP Christmas Baskets

LBP has a tradition of offering families Christmas baskets and gift cards. This year our school is once again supporting local charities under the leadership of Mr. Karpontinis, Ms Clarabut, and the Student Council. In addition, LBP families will a receive Christmas basket, new clothing, and gift certificates. We would like to thank our local merchants, the LBP staff, and the LBP parents for their generosity which included over \$1,500 in cash and \$1,400 in gift certificates. This initiative was led by our amazing staff including Titania Greco, Rachela Farella, Valery Ruscitti, Diana Cutrone, Maggie Cocco and Marissa Ruscitti.
