1. Welcome & Land Acknowledgment

- Mr. Vitantonio welcomed everyone at the start of the meeting at 6:45 pm.
- Luca Di Fiore and Bianca Morello read the Land Acknowledgement.

2. Adoption of the Agenda

 Motion was moved to adopt the agenda by Antoinette Licursi, seconded by Casey Gagné. All in favour.

3. Adoption of the minutes from the October 21, 2024, Governing Board meeting

 Motion was moved to approve the minutes by Gabriel Latino, seconded by Jocelyn Cacciatore. All in favour.

4. New Business:

4.1 Additional Ped. Day – Revised School Calendar

- ii) The date chosen for the additional ped. day by staff council is May 26, 2025.
- iii) No conflicts with June final exams, as some begin as early as May.
- iv) Revised calendar will be sent to community once GB approves the date.
 - Motion to approve the additional ped. day on May 26, 2025 was moved by Jocelyne Cacciatore, seconded by Annelisa Rende. All in favour.

4.2 Top Marks New Pant & Contract

- i) Mr. Vitantonio met with Top Marks for the annual review.
- ii) Sales were consistent to last year.
- iii) All orders were fulfilled in full and in part before the first day of school, if ordered by June.
- iv) Introducing a new pant for the girls: The 3484 style is a complementary option to the popular 3384 pant, sharing the same 4-way stretch fabric for all-day comfort. The main differences between these two styles lie in fit and construction. While the current 3384 pant features a jogger style with a relaxed fit, added hip room, an elastic back, and a pull-on design, the 3484 offers a slimmer fit with a button-and-zipper closure. The streamlined silhouette of the 3484 is particularly suited for students with leaner builds, including younger students who may not yet have fully grown. Both styles are available at the same price of \$57.25.
- v) They will be price freezing the process again this year for June orders.
- vi) They will also be extending the hours of their fitting centre to allow evenings for families who wish to go try on the items prior to purchasing.
- vii) Our contract is also coming to an end with Top Marks this year. If Mr. Vitantonio has GB's approval, he will schedule a meeting with Top Marks to look at our next contract.
- viii) Vote was held in order to explore the possibility of using a different supplier, but only 4 voted for it, so the vote wasn't carried.
- ix) Mr. Vitantonio will communicate with Top Marks about preparing a contract and voice

the concerns brought up about hosting fittings at the school. He will propose they present at January's meeting.

5. Reports

5.1 Principal

1. Educational Project (Information Item):

- a) The school is currently working on the analysis of educational project.
- b) There won't be a report done, but rather an initial review of strategies in place in the EP. Since it was due in March, we haven't gone through a full year for the usual reporting, so this is an intermediate step.
- c) As soon as this analysis is done, I will share it with Staff Council and GB

2. Lock Down Drill (Information item):

- a) We will be practicing our lock down protocol the week of December 9, 2024.
- b) A letter will be sent to families before the drill.
- c) It will be an in-house drill, as the SPVM no longer assists with the drills to minimize the level of stress for students and staff during the drill.
- d) The drill shouldn't last longer than 20 minutes.

3. Breakfast of Excellence (Information Item):

- a) Second to third week of December to honor the students who made the Honor Roll, and students who were nominated for Diligence. Sec. 1-5 on the 5 days.
- b) Breakfast will be a boxed breakfast, and students will be invited by level on each day for a quicker service and easier group management in the shared cafeteria space.
- c) It will take place period 2.

4. January Midyear Exams (Information item):

- a) Dates selected for theses midyear exams are January 24-27-28, 2025.
- b) Only selected courses will have the midyear exams.
- c) The school board felt that we should target only specific classes not to over 'test' students unnecessarily.
- d) The exams include tentatively History sec. 3 & 4, Math sec. 2 and 4, Science sec. 4.
- e) Teachers will hold in-class tests for evaluation purposes outside of these courses.

- f) We are looking to try to minimize class disruptions to classes by only having those grade levels writing their exams be affected by the exam day, but if we are limited on available teachers and staff to be able to cover the exam supervision and the teaching of the regular classes for the other grade levels, we may need to have a plan B and have the 3 days blocked for everyone for exams.
- g) I will have a conversation with Staff Council and get back to GB once a decision is made.

5. January Supplementals (Approval/Information item):

- a) We have exams taking place beginning during the week of January 6, 2025.
- b) We have about 20 students writing the science, and 20 student writing History.
- c) Letters will be sent home advising the families of these students.
- d) They need these credits for graduation.
- e) We also have about 14 students doing a special Art project for their missing Art credit for graduation. Special thank you to Ms. Koranteng for coordinating the project with them.
- f) Students will be coming in for exams only on those days of supplementals.

6. **Geordie Productions (Information item):**

- a) Play presentation for the secondary 5 students called "The Wolves" at the Segal Theatre took place.
- b) Students were bussed there and back on November 6 and 12, 2024.
- c) Secondary 4 students will be watching a play at school by Geordie productions called Megalodon.
- d) The date is February 5, 2025.
- e) Costs being absorbed by the school.

7. Camp Lift- Spring Break Camp (Information item):

- a) Spring Break Nature Camp being organized by Camp Lift.
- b) Takes place March 4-7, 2025.
- c) Free for students but require a \$100 deposit to reserve a spot
