
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New Business

5.1. Approval for Outdoor Play Space and Classroom Grant Application

- Mr. Romano and Ms. Lanni are preparing an application for a government grant for school yard beautification and creation of areas for outdoor play space and outdoor classroom space.
- This year it is possible to receive up to \$100,000 with a school contribution of 10% of the cost.
- Since Nesbitt is a decile 9 school, there is a possibility of accessing the entire \$100,000 without the
 requirement of contributing the full 10%.
- Some of the elements that are chosen for the application include: free standing musical instruments, chalkboard with doors, leaf play structure which would serve as seating for outdoor classroom, psychomotor course, slide to be built-in on the side of the hill in the yard.
- Entire cost is estimated at \$120,000 to \$130,000. If the grant is approved, there will be a tendering process.
- 60-65 kids can be accommodated in this area at a time.
- As the planted trees in the yard mature in the coming years, the elements are chosen to integrate
 with the green space. A member of the school board is working with the school to create a space
 for flowers and vines on the fence to create a green and more private space near the 6th avenue
 and rue de Bellechasse corner.
- The school might not be required to contribute the full 10%. There is promise from Nesbitt Home & School for approximately \$4,000 and there is possibility of planning additional fundraising events.
- Deadline to submit this application to the schoolboard is December 2nd, 2022, and deadline for the schoolboard to submit Nesbitt's application to the government is December 23rd, 2022. Expected time to hear the outcome of the application is May 2023 for work to start in June 2023.



- Budget for FSL reduced (tutor and specific materials)
- Budget for AMSFA increased (pays for tutors, additional teachers)

6. Reports

6.1. Principal Report

- Enrollment:
 - o 310 students, up 3 from September 30th.
- School Activities:
 - Nesbitt choir and music group sang at an indigenous reconciliation assembly hosted by Rosemont Highschool on November 19th. It was attended by a number of indigenous community chiefs including Kahsennenhawe Grand Chief Sky-Deer who gave a talk.
 - Grade 5 students attended a Remembrance Day commemoration on November 8th at the Royal Canadian Hussars in Mont-Royal. 5 EMSB schools were participating that day meeting with retired and active soldiers.
 - Report cards were issued on November 18th. There were some tech issues but to-date all parents should have access.
 - o Parent-teacher interviews were held on November 24th. Strong participation of parents for the first in-person interviews since the pandemic.

Nesbitt School Major Renovations:

- Addressing 3 questions that were raised in the last meeting:
 - Contingency plans for relocation: They are developing these plans but the goal of
 the project, as the plans and investigation continue, is to identify any issues at the
 source before the work starts. Goal is also that the job site is properly separated from
 the daily operations of the school. All health and safety considerations, including
 decontamination, are being followed
 - Plumbing entries from the city to the building: Main water entry, which connected the school to the city's aqueduct, was replaced in 2015-2016. At the time all existing pipes were changed to galvanized steel. There will be new plumbing on the "left side of the building" where the renovations take place, from main water entry to



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all required points. All plumbing that is under the school board's responsibility will be redone, beyond that it is the city's responsibility.

- Considerations for open and shared spaces Lab-École school model: There
 are constraints that go with that model, namely financial, since work is being done on
 an existing building. This poses limitations but as much as possible a state-of-the-art
 model will be incorporated to the school.
- Space allocation drawings are almost complete with some presentation given to managers or IT infrastructure and nutritional services for feedback.
- o Survey of schools continues outside school hours.
- Once the space allocation plans are approved at the board level, the architects will proceed with creating the final visual plans (approx. late January 2023). At that point the plans can be presented to parents (approx. March 2023).
- o In terms of measures for summer comfort: There will be no air-conditioning planned for the school however there will be a ventilated system planned for the school. All windows will be having blinds.
- o In terms of accessibility: Since Nesbitt accommodates students with physical disabilities, there are plans to have access to water in certain classrooms, accessible (universal) washrooms at each level and inclusion of ramps and elevators.
- Considerations for sensory rooms and classrooms with dimmable lights are planned, as well as storage space and smart board that are adjustable to student height.
- Considerations included to use as much as natural lighting as possible.
- There will be only 1 gymnasium (which can be divided in 2 separate parts), which is the same space as our current big gym. Our current mini gym will be a multi-functional room, which can be used to do physical activities but will not be built like a gym.
