Meeting started on point *5. Repots* since 1 parent was missing to have quorum (minimum 5 required). Meeting started with reports.

5. Reports

5.1. Principal Report

- Enrollment (Current):
 - 315 students increased from last meeting
- Enrollment (for Next Year):
 - 291 confirmed, 7 pending

School Activities:

- Play based and role-play activities that had started in April finished on May 10th. A specialized organization worked with Pre-K, Early Simulation, and junior WINGS students. At the end of this period, parents were invited to school to participate in some of the games with their kids. This would also allow the parents to continue the acquired skills at home.
- Assisted technology workshops in the month of April for students that are starting to use assisted tech in the upper grades, 4/5/6.
- Montreal Tundra basketball team came to Nesbitt on April 17th to give a presentation to Cycle 2. Students were invited to watch a quick exhibition game in our gym. Students in Cycle 2 and student council were offered free tickets to a game on May 12th. 160 tickets were given to parents.
- Used books sale benefitting the grad students took place on April 20th and 21st and was very successful. Lots books were offered, and students showed a lot of interest in the event.
- On April 25th Nesbitt held a staff-vs-students dodgeball game. Staff played vs Room 18. Students won 3-2.



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- On April 26th, grade 6 students hosted their grandmothers and mothers to the school for a grandmothers' tea event. It was the first time in the past 4 years and was great to welcome them to school during the afternoon.
- Exams have started in the week of May 1st with FSL. ELA also started on May 11th. Exams will
 continue until early June for grade 6 students.
- On May 5th the school had the Annual Welcome to Kindergarten event: 20 new students and their parents came to the school. There was a welcome walk and kids participated in 5 separate activities to experience classroom setting.
- o On May 2nd, Cycle 2 French Immersion went to Maison Gabriel.
- o On May 8th, Cycle 2 English Core had a visit to Biodome, and WINGS senior was also able to join.

Sophie Currie joined the meeting at 6:48 pm

- On May 10th, Cycle 3 went to Halo Race in Mont-Royal. A lot of grade 5 and 6 students attended the race. 6 Nesbitt students were in the top 10 in finishing the race and one student was in 2nd place.
- o On May 15th pre-K visited Ecomuseum Zoo.
- In April, the school purchased and received bikes, helmets, and accessories. This is part of the Cycliste averti program suggested by a member of Nesbitt Governing Board last year. Practice started in the gym and now is continuing in the school yard for grades 4 and 5. Next year will be expanded to grades 4, 5 and 6. The plan is to eventually try trips on the bike paths around the school.
- On May 31st there will be a spring concert at Rosemont Highschool in which the entire school will be participating. Invitations will be sent out soon.


School Renovation Progress:

- School has started discarding the items no longer needed with 2 visits from a recycling company to help the school to take out and sort most of the items not needed. About 90% of items not needed have been removed.
- Minor preliminary work almost completed in the upper floors. Transfer of smart boards, projectors, and other items still in use, will be done after the school years ends.
- The company for the major preliminary work over the course of summer 2023 was selected and approved by the School Board. Kick-off meeting to meet them is scheduled for May 18th. The name of the company is not yet announced. Work will start in the week of June 26th.
- Focus of summer 2023 work is to make the school ready for August 15th when staff return to school. Work asked to be completed by this date include:
 - Splitting the Wi-Fi, plumbing
 - Creating 2 classrooms where currently the snack bar is located
 - Converting a current unused spaced on the 4th floor to student washrooms
 - Re-arranging current staff washrooms
 - Moving equipment/furniture/other material
 - Creating an emergency exit in the gym
 - Put up fencing since bus entrance for the kids will be re-located
- Call for tender and selection process for the major renovations will be during the summer with work expected to start in September 2023

Ouestions:

- Ms. Santino asked about the date for the concert
 - M. Romano: May 31st and an invitation will be sent out to parents soon providing all the details
- Ms. Santino asked about the safety and security of students and staff during the work and what assurances are expected, regarding air quality etc?
 - M. Romano: This will be the job of the environmental engineer. This perhaps is not in the scope of work during the summer. However, this will be part of responsibility of the contactor in







charge of work after September 2023 since they do the rest of the renovations and necessary demolitions. The contactor must put safety mechanisms in place that are validated by environmental engineers and the architectural company to assess the jobs and feasibility of work planned. They present their plans, which must be approved and then there will be oversight and visits to ensure they are implementation.

4. New Business

- 4.1. Approval for School Fees
 - School fees was presented to Governing Board and budget for school year will be presented in the next meeting.
 - School fees are for the consumables: workbooks and worksheet
 - Itemized lists for the grades are provided. School wide comparison chart is also provided. Fees have increased due to the increase in the price of workbooks themselves. Some items not used are eliminated to try and balance this effect. This can be seen in fees that have reduced. Fee increase is 5 to 10\$.
 - Questions:
 - Ms. Di Martino asked if there are programs to assist low-income families for these fees? Mr. Romano: There are organizations to help the families. For example, 2 families in Nesbitt get help through the Montreal Hellenic Society to pay fees. Other community access exists. The school also permits the option of spreading the payments. For families that still have difficulties, the books are still provided to students, school always works with the families to meet the needs.
