6. Community Representatives Report (5 minutes)

Michael D. Greene Center- After school going well. 8-10 per day. A lot of stage students coming to volunteer. March break camp has about 10 spots left. Summer camp hasn't started planning yet. Homework program incorporated with afterschool activities. Jennifer from Tyndale- Still signing kids up for March break camp, still spots available. Afterschool going well. Planning for summer camp. Homework program about 45 mins. Jonathan from YMCA (absent, report read by vice principal on his behalf)- Before and afterschool programs running well numbers increasing. Ped days doing well. March break is full with a waiting list. Summer daycamp registration has started. If any other information to

include in reports please let him know.

7. Miss Nancy special guest report on Organized Play (10 minutes)

Plan is to introduce organized play. Helps to encourage the kids to be more positive with each other and to create a less chaotic/more relaxed feeling in the playground. Presented a mockup of the schoolyard and what the kids do in the different areas.

Introduced boundaries with pylons to prevent injuries, etc. Helps to keep the kids within the boundaries.

She went to all the classrooms to discuss this with them.

Don't maximize the use of all the doors, leads to chaos. Will discuss with teachers this coming Friday at their meeting to optimize this, hopefully after March break.

Added new activities ie. Sleds

New games/activities for each season

Some kids don't like sports so friendship bracelets, chalk, etc. so they have something to do. Kindness and respect program with K students.

Want to introduce safety measures ie. Kids go out before the teachers go out

Getting reflective vests for the supervisors outside so that they are more visible.

Question asked if part of her mandate is to look for ostracized/bullied students, Ms. Nancy is always on the lookout for that.

Leadership program- Potentially finding a way for grades 5 and 6 to receive official recognition for supervising younger kids. There is a complication that their recess is not at the same time, more volunteer recognition for the grades 5 and 6s will be considered in the future.

8. Teacher's Report (10 minutes)

Jinan Grade 5/6 French- Still in winter theme. Working on posters and French winter words. Also currently working on story telling program (school wide in cycle 3) so working a lot on drama and body language/miming.

Julie- Had author visit and they wrote stories. Got feedback from other classes. Grade 1 digital books complete and started doing secret stories for sounds.

Kathleen Grade 5/6 English- Also working on story-telling and the students tell a personal/non secretive narrative. Work on perseverance and black history month.

9. EMSB Parents Committee Report (5 minutes)

9.1 Follow-up on drafting a letter to support EMSB stance against Bill 96, 40 and 21 *Suzanne went for Daniel K last month.*

Want to set up a fund for families who lose someone.

They will draft a letter for Bills 96, 40 and 21, will receive more information later on about the EMSB stance and if we want to support the position/letter.

10. Vice Principal Report (10 minutes)

February 1- had a presentation on Tracking Black Canada done with all grades 3-6 students. Spiritual animator did presentations with grades 3-6. Also working with Pre-K and K on March 16 to do a black history presentation.

In-person visit of Lewis Cohen (former Roslyn student and brother of creator of Stranger Things) to help with career planning and discussions.

Feb 13-17 Staff Appreciation Week, thank you to HandS and School administration. Was also kindness week at EMSB, had 3 Roslyn students participate ina video that is on YouTube. Feb 13 Marymount Academy Steel Pans Band did presentations by grade level, as part of Black History Month. Musical and history presentation.

Feb 15 select student of Caribou Math contest wrote another competition, still 2 left to do. Feb 17 100 day of school celebration for Prek and K students.

Feb 22 pink shirt day, anti-bullying day. Will be holding assemblies to highlight this. Feb 24 ped day

Feb 27 closing off black history month DJ Malik coming to the school to do a virtual presentation with grades 3-6.

Feb 28 dress down day to raise funds for graduating class

All activities being done at the school are consistent/emphasize with the EMSB respect campaign. Kindness, building empathy and respect.

11. Principal Report (10 minutes)

Thank all the teachers and support staff for all their hard work. Everyone celebrated last week. Thank VP Mireille.

Enrollment for next year 583 students, expecting some more. Will staff conservatively for next year because still an on-going teacher shortage. Will potentially have some split classes in the older grades. A conversation ensued suggesting informing parents mid-August about the potential for split classes, along with details about what that means for the students (such as it is for independent learners and usually very successful, etc)."

12.1. EMSB Respect Campaign at Roslyn

All activities coincide with Respect campaign.

12.2. Hot lunch reusable cutlery (with Approval)

New law has come into effect involving banning single-use plastics ie. Utensils. For food supplier Merenda and as of March 28 they will cease to provide the utensils. Proposal to ask them to continue supplying these utensils until the end of the school year. Need to decide this.

In the new class year, they will no longer provide students with plastic utensils. Will have to decide how students will be provided with utensils. (1) can charge the parents for eco utensils (2) not charge the parents but increase price of food and provide eco utensils.

For today=> Do we continue asking Merenda to provide utensils until the end of the year. Mireille- For the parents to change things end of March will create a lot of situations of students with no utensils and creating a lot of traffic in the office. So as a school it would be better to let them supply it until the end of June. But then starting fresh next year for hot lunch need to have utensils.

Suzanne- A lot of traffic in the office already. It wouldn't stop us from doing the cutlery fundraiser at the same time.

Vote-> To propose Merenda to continue to supply until the end of June 22, 2023. Merenda will no longer supply the students utensils after Marhch 28, 2023. Roslyn chooses the option they will be obligated to supply the utensils until June 22, 23.
