
Mr. Peter Mckelvie, will be replacing me as of the new school year and I wish him much success. We will be meeting to ensure that the transition is a smooth one.

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Fun Facts About the Month of June

June is a time of extremes. If you live in the northern hemisphere, then it's a time when summer is really starting to get into full swing! Every day lasts just that little bit longer, making breezy summer evenings a real treat.

If you live in the southern hemisphere though, then it's a time when winter starts to set in properly. The days are shortening, and the nights are becoming fresher and fresher.

- The name *June* is the modern day adaption of the Latin word *Junius*, which has its origins dating back to the ancient Romans. There are multiple theories as to what the month of June was named after. One theory is that it was named after the Roman goddess of marriage, Juno.
- June used to be the fourth month in the year. Before Julius Caesar came to power, the calendar year only had 10 months. In 46 BC he created the Julian calendar by adding two more months to the year, which made June the sixth month.
- No other month in the year begins on the same day of the week as June.
- June has both the longest and the shortest days of the year, depending on where you're standing! If you live in the northern hemisphere, then June 21st is the longest day of the year. If you live in the southern hemisphere, then the 21st is the shortest day of the year.
- If you were born in June, then you're one of two star signs. If you were born on or before June 20th then you're a Gemini. If you're born on or after the 21st of June, though, then you have the Cancer star sign.
- June has three birthstones – alexandrite, moonstone, and pearl.
- The birth flowers of June are the honeysuckle and the rose.

Ms Samantha's Mindful Corner



Dear Parents/Guardians,

Although our mindfulness sessions have concluded, it is the intention that this is only the beginning. By now you and your child have learned that there are many ways to practice mindfulness throughout our day.

We have learned that mindfulness does not necessarily make our life easier, but it does give us tools to help widen our window of resilience. We've learned that our lives are filled with ups and downs, that all possibilities are welcome, and when we need to, we can just take a breath or two, go for a mindful walk, send kind wishes to ourselves and to others, or use one of the many other tools we've discovered in our mindfulness lessons.

Over the summer months I encourage you to continue these practices in simple everyday moments:

- Invite your child to practice Mindful Listening for 30 seconds and notice what sounds they hear. This can be done while riding in the car, walking to the store, etc.
- Have your child pick their favorite stuffed animal and place it on their belly. Have them take five breaths with their buddy, watching the stuffed animal move up and down.
- Before eating dinner, have everyone practice these words:
I wish for everyone here to be safe
I wish for everyone here to be happy
I wish for everyone here to be healthy
I wish for everyone here to be at ease
- Have your child scan the area with mindful eyes and name something they see that is soft, that is hard, or that is squishy.
- The next time an emotion comes up, you can notice it, label it, and ask them where they feel the emotion in their body. Sometimes we notice negative emotions more, but we can pay attention to joy and happiness too!
- Have your child reflect on 3 moments they are grateful for from their day.
- Mindful walking can be practiced everywhere you go--walking in the grocery store, walking to the park, walking around the house or apartment, or walking to the bus stop.

Important Information

Gentle Reminder for Morning Drop-off your child must be dropped off in the school yard by 8:55 a.m. Teacher supervision begins at 8:55 a.m. If the school yard gates are closed, please escort your child to the front office. To ensure everyone's safety and a systematic entry, the teachers are not able to open the gate for late arrivals. Thank you for your understanding.

In case of rain, parents are asked to bring their child to the main entrance of the school at 8:55 a.m. (at first bell). They will then proceed to the school gym where teachers will greet them.

Children Pick-Up upon dismissal of classes at 3:50 p.m. all students who walk home will exit by the junior yard door. Children attending daycare will be brought to their after school classroom. The only children leaving from the front door are the children that take the bus home.

If there is a change to your child's after school dismissal we ask that you contact the main office by **12 p.m.** to notify changes to your child's routine.

Please note that all visitors must report to the Front Office.

Student Absences/Changes to Routine parents must call the school at 514 369 0070 before 9:00 a.m. and state the child's name, room number and reason for their child's absence. If no one answers the phone, please leave a message on the answering machine (the answering machine is on overnight). Please ensure that the school is notified before 12 p.m. if there is a change in routine for dismissal at the end of the day.



Advantages to Being on Time to School

Arriving on time for school ensures that your child doesn't miss out on the important learning activities that happen early in the day when they are most alert. Set your child up for success and make certain he/she arrives to school **On Time. Every Time.**

Arriving to School on Time Allows Your Child:

- To have a smooth transition period - students who arrive at school with time to spare have the opportunity to settle into the classroom, prepare their materials and focus their minds on the lessons to come.
- To acquire important information – a typical school day starts with announcements and introductions to new lessons and concepts. Students who show up late may miss out on important details and be unprepared for future class events or key learning concepts.
- To develop long-term positive habits – when students show up on time to school every day, they develop the habit of being punctual with important commitments.
- To gain self-esteem - arriving on time every day **makes children feel good about themselves.**

We are pleased to announce that once again parents have the option of ordering all school supplies needed for their child from Editions Vaudreuil. All orders must be submitted before July 16, 2022 in order to ensure that the orders can be filled. Any order received after July 16th, runs the risk of being ready after the start of the school year due to supply shortages.

Instructions From Editions Vaudreuil on How to Place an Order

- 1- Complete the order form. Please include all of your contact information. Then mail the order form to **2891, DU MEUNIER STREET, VAUDREUIL-DORION, QC J7V 8P2** or fax it to **450-455-0301**. Don't forget to include your credit card number with the expiry date.
- 2- Order direct online in <http://scolaire.editionsv.qc.ca>; and choose only the desired items by simply indicating the quantity required for each item on your list. You can use your credit card on our secure site in conjunction with PayPal. **ONLINE SITE WILL BE ACTIVE AS OF JUNE 25TH ONLY.**
- 3- Please note that due to high volume, **WE DO NOT TAKE ORDERS BY PHONE.**
- 4- A handling fee of \$5.00 is now applied for the preparation of an order.

Payment Methods:

- 1- In order to avoid delays, please send your cheque promptly if you decide to pay by cheque. **PLEASE NOTE THAT NO POSTDATED CHEQUES WILL BE ACCEPTED.** Your order will only be processed once your cheque has been cashed.
- 2- By credit card, simply enter your credit card number with the expiration date on your order form or pay directly online.

Delivery:

- 1- Directly to your home: The order must be pre-paid by cheque or credit card to use this option. You have a choice between Canada Post or Purolator. Please note that if you select Canada Post, they will leave a card to pick up the parcel at the nearest post office. For Purolator option, please ensure that there will be someone at the delivery address that can sign for the order. An email will be sent to you as soon your package leaves our warehouse with a tracking number to track your shipment.
- 2- Pick-up at school: To take advantage of this option, your order must be received before August 1st (if available).
- 3- **SCHOOL PICK-UP WILL BE THURSDAY AUGUST 25 FROM 3:00 TO 5:00 P.M (if available).**
- 4- Pick-up at the warehouse: Our warehouse is located at 240, Loyola-Schmidt, Suite #120, Vaudreuil-Dorion, J7V 8P2. You can pay for orders by cash, debit or credit card when picking them up. Please note that since the warehouse is not a store, it is not possible to add items to your order at time of pick-up. The store situated at 480 Harwood Blvd, Vaudreuil-Dorion is 2 minutes from the warehouse and you are welcome to shop there for any extra or last-minute items. **PLEASE WAIT FOR CONFIRMATION THAT YOUR ORDER IS READY BEFORE COMING TO THE WAREHOUSE, A REPRESENTATIVE WILL BE CONTACT WITH YOU WHEN YOUR ORDER IS COMPLETED.**
- 5- **PLEASE NOTE THAT NO ORDERS WILL BE SENT TO SCHOOL AFTER SCHEDULED DATE OF SCHOOL PICK-UP.** For late orders, you will need to either come to our warehouse to take possession of your order or choose home delivery (shipping charge applies).



