

Ms. Holly submitted that two ministry funded Pre-K classes to start in 2023 -2024 school year at WPS and explained matters around this subject to GB following which Mr. David moved, Ms. Deborah seconded, Cristina abstainments (as she joined meeting just after the vote), all in favour hence unanimously approved.

# 4. Items requiring discussion (20 minutes)

## 4.1 Communication

# • Board response to requested communication tool

Mr. Rony submitted that the EMSB decided to go with what the MEQ is promoting as the software of choice for all Quebec school which is the Mozaik portal and its mobile app mParent. EMSB have been advised to provide prompt feedback to developers of our GB's approved motion on the key features that the app must have to best meet the urgent and pressing needs around communication through the app, namely:

- 1. Time sensitive private chat functionality (both ways, teachers to parents and vice-versa)
- 2. Message read notification
- 3. Immediate translation and notification service

EMSB have also been informed that WPS GB will also provide feedback on the current user interface of the Mozaik portal following discussions with teachers and parents.

## Google reviews

Ms. Shalani informed the GB on existing Google reviews that our school has on its Google search page and discussed points around how best to communicate with parents that leave such reviews. Ms. Holly said she will find out how best to respond to those reviews. GB members agreed that communicating with public reviews reflects positively on the school in many ways given the age of digital information now.


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## 4.2 Possible projects for next year

## 5.3 Daycare Report



The last PC meeting was held on June 1<sup>st</sup> 2023. Some key matters of the agenda were as follows:


- 1. Parenst confrence: The one week parent confrence was a success partly due to the hybride options of the confrence this year enabling more flexibility for attendence.

- 4. Bill C-13 The PC is drafting a resolution in support of Mr. Anthony Housefather's challenge of Bill C-13 as the PC shares the opinion that "The bill C-13 will only further erode the rights of the English minority communities of Quebec."


