• Commissioner Julien Feldman

Mr. Feldman shared his advocacy for families who get rejected from schools due to the lack of resources particularly special needs students and it was well received by the GB.

- Bill 96 related questions:

Ms. Bel asked questions on behalf of parents around the effects of Bill 96 to which Mr. Feldman shared his broad ranging and general views on how this may affect many people and the status quo.

- Can a temporary worker renew their English eligibility under Bill 96?

We are waiting for government approval.

Any temporary stay before June 1^{st} , 2022, can renew for 1 year and any temp stay after June 1^{st} 2022 can only have eligibility up to 2 years and then cannot renew.

What is the EMSB doing about environmental sustainability?

Schools are taking their own initiatives on sustainability and the EMSB acknowledges them.

WPS has a "Green Committee in school, no plastic utensils for hot lunches, composting program, recycling, gardening, reducing waste etc are some initiatives.

3.1 Staff letter to EMSB



5.2 <u>Teacher's Report</u>

February Teacher's Report:

School Wide:

- In honour of Black History at WPS, CityTV News did a segment all about classroom projects and interviewed cycle 3 students to hear about their experiences.
- Resources from the Multicultural committee were shared with staff for BHM, as well as a STEAM door decorating activity, school-wide scavenger hunt and carnival event planned for the end of the month.
- Pink shirt day will be held on Wednesday, February 22nd as a school-wide initiative to speak out against bullying.
- WestCan Folk Dance Company came to school on a rotating schedule to teach dancing workshops with all classes as a celebration of Caribbean culture.
- We celebrated World Read Aloud Day on February 1st, and participated in a D.E.A.R. activity.
- WPS staff would like to extend a big thank you to the administration, Governing Board, and our lovely PPO for Staff Appreciation Week.



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- Kindergarten prepared special activities for groundhog day: They made puppets, painted faces and crawled through tunnels to look at books, and had a groundhog food snack.
- Lawyers from BLG continue to read to the students bi-weekly.
- Kindergarten celebrated their 100th day of school celebration where they made crowns and banners, counted 10X10 treats for snacks, did 100 exercises, had a special visit from the Zero Hero and had a parade throughout the school with instruments.
- For this year's Valentine's Day celebration, Mrs Debbie Beitel (former WPS teacher) was a special visitor and read a story together, sang songs and danced with the children.

Cycle 1

- Rooms 114 and 119 (Grade 2) are working on a Multiculturalism project celebrating our similarities and differences. Feb. 10th we held a "Bits and Bites" afternoon students brought in snacks and desserts from around the world. They shared mini presentations on the snack and when it would be eaten (everyday or special occasions.) We also had a student perform a traditional dance from India and watched dances from other countries on the Smartboard.
- Rooms 114 and 119 (Grade 2) participated in a stop motion animation project. They worked in groups to create 2D settings and characters and had a movie premiere morning on January 25th. It was a great success.
- All Grade 2 students visited Verdun Circus School and are participating in a "clown" project as part of Ecole Montrealaise.

Cycle 2

- Grade 3 and 4 enjoyed their field trip to the Montreal Biodome and enjoyed learning about different animals and their habitats.
- Cycle 2 fundraiser was a success with a total of 1900\$ raised after expenses. This money will help support the Cycle 2 program as well as future field trips. 500\$ of fundraising amount will be donated to families in need within our school community before March break.
- Grade 4 continues to participate in the Youth Fusion theatre program with Mr. Mireck
- "All ABoard Games" workshop begins in February and continues through March, including several grade 4, 5 and 6 participating classrooms.

• Leadership club sent goodies to the classes and made friendship bracelets with all classes during recesses

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
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- Malik Shaheed, a Canadian youth and community advocate, is speaking to school on February 28th as a part of Black History Month







