WILLIAM MARCUS PEPPER, JR was a Pilot Officer

He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and fought in the Second World War.

- He was born on January 6th, 1920
- He died on December 17th, 1941

He was born in Shawinigan in the Maurice region of Quebec. He was the son of William Marc and Blanche Frigon Pepper, and he was married to Audrey-Elizabeth Pepper. He studied at Westmount High School and graduated in 1937. He enlisted himself to go fight in WWII and was a Pilot Officer in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Unfortunately, he was killed on active service two weeks after his arrival overseas. He died in Millom, Copeland Borough, Cumbria, England. He was buried at Haverigg (St Luke) in Cumberland, England. His grave is plot 429.






