-Flight Sergeant George Barclay Robb was born on March 8, 1914 in Saskatchewan, Canada. He was part of the RCAF and participated in defending Great Britain with 20 000 aviators.

-He died on September 7, 1942 at the age of 28 during a nighttime trainingexercise across the UK. His plane stalled and crashed after experiencing power loss in a sharp turn.


