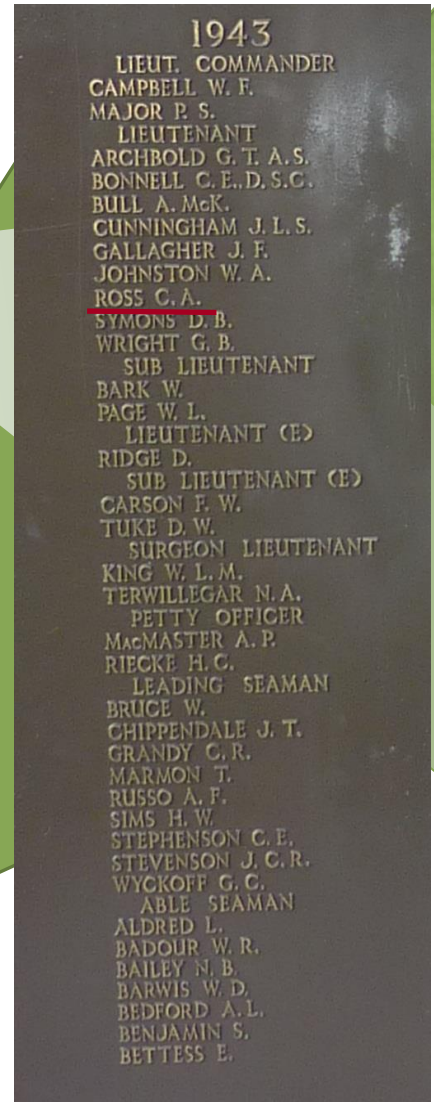


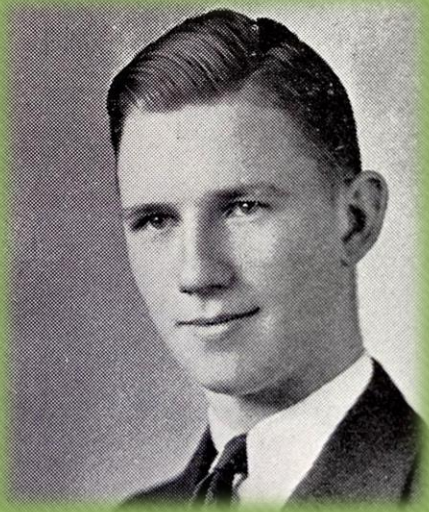


LIEUT. ALEX. C. ROSS, RCNVR.

SEPT. 1943.



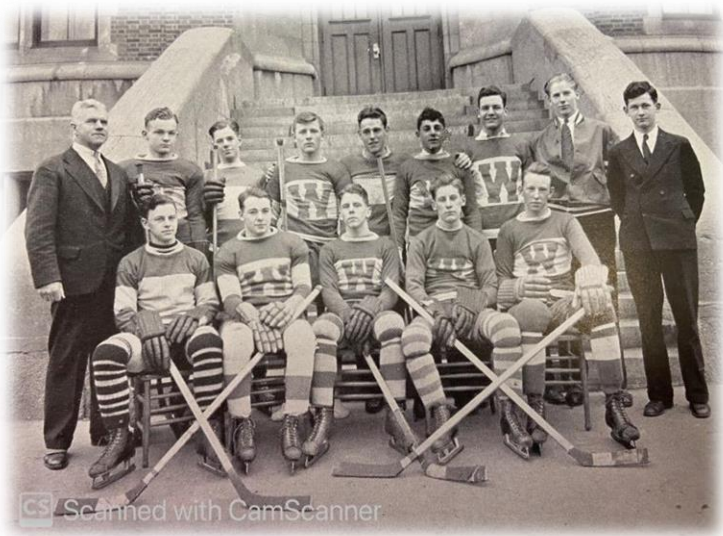
“Charles Alexander Ross, otherwise known as Alex. C. Ross was an accomplished graduate at Westmount High School. He was born in Montreal, Québec on July 7, 1916. Alex was the son of Charles Hamilton Ross & Harriet H. Ross. He was the husband of Mona Jean Ross. Ross joined the navy and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve. He trained at HMCS King's, otherwise known as the navy's officer training establishment, located in Halifax. Alexander was ranked a Lieutenant. September 20, 1943 was the day Ross tragically lost his life at the age of twenty-seven. German submarines sank HMCS St. Croix, as well as eight various allied warships and vessels. Alexander's memorial site is the Halifax Memorial, but his final resting place is currently unknown.”





Alexander competed in Jr. football, water polo & was on the boy's hockey throughout high school.

Ross graduated high school in 1934 then attended McGill University & received a B.A and a Master's degree in economics.
