He was educated at Westmount High School and spent two years studying engineering at McGill.



Enlisting on his 19th birthday as a gunner for the R.C.A. He trained for ten weeks at Lauden Farm, Ontario. He chose to defer his officer training for three months so he could be deployed to France with his unit.

His parents were informed that he was killed in action in France, according to the obituary released by the Montreal Star on July 28^{th,} 1944. His remains were buried in the Bretteville Sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France. The Canadian forces buried in this cemetery, died in the latter part of the Battle of
