


Thomas Angus McCoy Smith, son of Allan L. and Isabel Smith, was born in 1915 and graduated from Westmount High School in 1933. He then went on to get his B.A. degree at McGill University in 1940 and then went on to enlist in the army. He was the husband of Ruth Smith.

In 1944, he was killed in action. He was buried at Beny-Sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France, where over 2,000 people are buried.
