Chairperson's message:

The two main strengths of Willingdon's Governing Board are the level of involvement of our parents, faculty and community representatives, and the positive working relationship between the members of the GB and the school administration. Although this was only my first year as chairperson, it was clear to me from our first meeting that all of us share a commitment to ensuring that Willingdon remains an inclusive and safe environment that meets the needs of all of our students. Willingdon's teachers and staff offer a variety of worthwhile educational opportunities and extra-curricular activities.
