Criteria	To make the most of your continuing education experience, please:
Select an activity that meets your needs	Assess your learning needs through resources including the PET or RCDSO self-assessment tool. Consider the method of delivery as well as the content and select an approach that works best for you. Engage in a range of CE activities to stay current in your knowledge, skills and judgment throughout your career. Participate in activities that you can use to learn how to incorporate standards of care and the latest scientific evidence and advances in technology into practice.
Attend and participate	Attend the full course / complete the activity in its entirety. Participate in polls and discussion periods. Complete the quiz (as required).
Record the activity in your e-Portfolio	Obtain a certificate of completion or other verification document. Go to ePortfolio > ADD New Activity Record Now > Attendance Verification and hover over the icon for examples of acceptable verification documents. Enter the activity to your e-Portfolio. Select if you have: • uploaded your verification document(s), once your entry to e-Portfolio has been approved per the status field, no other documentation is required by the College to satisfy CE requirements. You may choose to keep your original certificates or attendance records but are not required to do so. • elected to maintain paper copies, you must retain your attendance records for at least 5 years after the end of the CE cycle and provide them to the College when requested for audit of your e-Portfolio.
Apply what you've learned to your practice	Review related RCDSO Standards, Guidelines and Advisories to confirm that material presented in the course is consistent with Ontario requirements. Recognize that materials and methods presented in the course may include practices that are outside the scope of practice of dentistry as defined in Dentistry Act, 1991, S.O. 1991, c. 24 (ontario.ca). Exercise your professional judgment before applying learning to ensure that you stay within scope and practice according to the RCDSO's Standards, Guidelines and Advisories.
